Admissions Procedure and Academic Results

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Our admissions policy aims to select those girls who we believe will thrive academically, socially and in their personal development in the vibrant and exciting environment which Guildford High has to offer.

The main intake ages are 4, 7 and 11 and girls may also join at Sixth Form. Girls whose parents are moving to the Guildford area will be considered at other times if places are available.

REGISTRATION

The first step for any girl wishing to join Guildford High is Registration; this involves completion of the registration form and payment of the non-refundable registration fee (currently £150).

Parents may register their daughter(s) at any time (there is no advantage to early registration) but, in order to take the entrance examination, pupils must be registered by the following deadlines.

The registration deadline for pupils entering Reception in September 2023 is 1st October 2022.

The registration deadline for girls entering Sixth Form in September 2023 is 17th October 2022.

The registration deadline for pupils entering Yr 1 – Yr 10 in September 2023 is 1st November 2022.

OFFERS AND ACCEPTANCE

Offers of places are typically made within a fortnight of the entrance assessment and parents confirm acceptance of a place by returning a signed Acceptance Form and paying a non-refundable £1000 Acceptance Deposit.

ENTRY AT 4+

For entry at 4+ in September 2023, girls will be invited to take part in our readiness assessments on Wednesday 9 November and Saturday 12 November 2022.

On 9 November there will be a group craft activity session which allows girls to mix with their peers and our teachers. On 12 November girls will take part in games and activities with a teacher. We will assess the learning potential in language development, number and general cognitive skills, manipulative and social skills but reading ability is not assessed. Each of the two sessions will last for approximately 45 minutes and exact timings will be confirmed during October. All applicants are required to attend both sessions.

ENTRY AT 7+

The entrance examination for ages 7+ and older will be held on Friday 6 January 2023 for September 2023 entry. For entry to the Junior School, the tests consist of written papers in English comprehension, creative writing, spelling and grammar and Mathematics. A report will be requested from each candidate's current school prior to the examination.

ENTRY AT 11+

The entrance examination for entry at 11+ will be held on Sunday 20 November 2022 and Friday 6 January 2023. Assessments will take place at Guildford High School. To be considered for a place, a candidate must attend both entrance days.

On 20 November candidates will take part in a one-hour computer-based test (CEM test) comprising verbal, numerical and non-verbal exercises.

All applicants will also be invited to attend our Interview Day on 6 January 2023.

Our Interview Day will provide an opportunity for applicants to experience life at GHS as well as a variety of activity sessions and interview. Whilst informal in nature, the interview will explore creative thinking and analytical skills as well as providing candidates with the opportunity to tell us all about themselves. Girls will not be sitting written test papers during our Interview Day.

A report will also be requested from each candidate's current school prior to the examination. All candidates who attend on both 20 November and 6 January will be automatically entered for academic scholarship and there is no separate scholarship examination.

ENTRY AT 12+ AND ABOVE

Candidates sitting for entry to Years 8 and 9 will be assessed in English and Maths and be interviewed by a senior teacher.

The Mathematics examination for entry to Years 8 and above (excluding Sixth Form) is set by the Mathematics department. The test has a short answer format and the candidates are required to show all of their working. In recognition of the variety of methods which might be used, any logical and accurate working would be acceptable. There may be questions which require facts, properties and geometrical names. The paper may also include more rigorous problem-solving questions.

The English examination for entry to Years 8 and above (excluding Sixth Form) is set by the English department and will be a comprehension exercise.

Candidates sitting for entrance Year 10 will also be required to sit a one-hour Science paper covering biology, physics and chemistry.

It is school policy not to issue past papers. Entrance assessments for Years 8-10 will only take place if places are available in the relevant year group. Please do not register for assessment until you have spoken to the Admissions team and they have confirmed that assessments will be held.

ENTRY AT 16+

Candidates for entry to the Lower Sixth in September 2023 will attend the Sixth Form Assessment Day on Tuesday 8 November 2022. The day will combine examinations and an interview carried out by the Headmistress, Head of Sixth Form or other Heads of Department. Candidates sit three, one-hour subject related papers (subjects of their choice from a set of options) and a separate general paper. A report will be requested from each candidate's current school prior to assessment. All candidates will be automatically entered for scholarship and there is no separate scholarship examination.

Offers of places are conditional on the following grades at GCSE:

- Minimum of seven grades 9-7 (or equivalent) including English Language and Mathematics
- Grades 9 or 8 in subjects being studied in the Sixth Form

Scholarships, Bursaries and Fees

Academic and Music Scholarships are available at 11+ and 16+.

ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

At 11+ the Academic Scholarships are worth up 5% of the fees and are awarded on the basis of the entrance examination and interviews. All candidates attending the two entrance assessment days are automatically considered and there is no separate scholarship examination.

At 16+ the Academic Scholarships are worth up to 5% of the fees. All candidates sitting for entrance will be automatically considered and there is no separate scholarship examination. All candidates are required to sit a general scholarship paper (logic and essay) plus three other papers.

All scholarships are available to internal and external candidates. Exhibitions (lesser awards) may also be available according to the calibre of the candidates.

MUSIC SCHOLARSHIPS

Music Scholarships are open to girls who satisfy the normal academic entrance requirements. All Music Scholars are expected to be fully committed to school musical activities. An external adjudicator and the Director of Music will be present at the auditions. Application forms for Music Scholarships are available from the Admissions Office.

11+ Music Scholarships are worth up to 5% of the fees. Auditions take place shortly after the 11+ entrance examination day. The award is made in the light of musical potential as well as actual achievement. Candidates should normally have reached Grade 4-5 on their orchestral instrument and their playing should be of Distinction quality. On certain instruments or in special circumstances it may not have been possible to reach this standard. An award may be made in respect of a candidate's piano playing if this is of an exceptionally good standard. If in doubt, please consult the Director of Music. Candidates are required to perform one piece on an orchestral instrument and, normally, one on the piano. Pieces should be approximately three minutes in length. There are also sight-reading and aural tests and an interview. Original compositions are of interest, but not essential.

Sixth Form Music Scholarships are worth up 5% of the fees. Auditions take place in mid October of the year prior to entry. Candidates will be expected to perform a piece of about four to five minutes in length on both their principal and second instruments. Candidates should be at Grade 8 standard on their principal instrument, although the examination may not have been taken, and their playing should be of Distinction quality. If the piano is the principal instrument, candidates should have reached a good standard on an orchestral instrument or be a good choral singer of Chamber Choir standard with the ability to sight-sing and sustain an independent part. There are also sight-reading and aural tests and an interview. The Director of Music and the Adjudicator would welcome the opportunity to look at, and perhaps hear, a composition if the candidate has been involved in composing.

BURSARIES

Bursaries are available for the daughters of the clergy.

ASSISTED PLACES

A number of Assisted Places are available to all internal and external candidates at 11+ entry. Application forms will be provided by the Director of Admissions prior to sitting the entrance examination. These are awarded on the basis of financial need. The Assisted Place policy sets out the criteria for award.
